



PENNSYLVANIANS WANT U.S. INVESTMENT AGAINST GLOBAL DISEASE



New polling indicates that Pennsylvanians across party lines support US investments to combat disease overseas.

69% of Pennsylvanians agree that the US government should invest in **preventing and treating diseases in other countries** to reduce the risk of future outbreaks in the United States [compared to only 14% who disagree, and 17% of neither view].

Support is even stronger for programs aimed at **ending the HIV/AIDS epidemic**, with **74% of Pennsylvanians** supporting US funding [compared to 10% opposed, and 15% with neither view].

The summer 2025 nationwide poll by Stack Data Strategy and the ONE Campaign indicates that majority support exists across party lines, including among those who identify as Republican or conservative.

Global Health Investments Support Pennsylvania Jobs. Even most of the minority who expressed opposition said they would be likely to support such funding if they knew it would be used to buy medicines and equipment from American companies, which does in fact happen.

- Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, is the single largest purchaser of US-made vaccines. **Gavi spends more in the US than the US contributes to Gavi** -- buying Pennsylvania-made materials and technologies that support livelihoods in our state and around the country.
- US support to the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria also generates US returns, given the Global Fund's procurement from American businesses, including **\$527 million spent in Pennsylvania since 2010.**
